About the Seminar

India is a country of plural society. It has many castes and communities residing within its territory that impart multiethnic identity to its nationhood. Traditionally many communities /social groups are in an advantageous position over others by way of privileging power, position and resources where as others remain excluded from the same. This has resulted in the vast differential in terms of development between the communities pushing some at the margin. They include schedule tribe, schedule castes, women, people with disabilities, religious minority groups and others.

Owing to their poor access to resource these communities suffer from numerous social and economic problems. They are discriminated against and are subjugated leading to little control over their lives. It is ironic that even after employing the policy of inclusive growth, the social and economic development of these groups is still overdue. As many studies indicate development itself is lopsided as far as its advantages are expected to benefit these communities. However there have been several government initiatives for the upliftment and mainstreaming these groups which have shown some positive result. The conference is aimed at proper understanding of marginalized group in the present context and help in bringing together various issues that are relevant in formulation of adequate policy interventions for the underprivileged. With this perspective the seminar has following themes:

Sub Themes:

Proceedings of the seminar are proposed to be organized under the following sub-themes:

- Status of social and economic development of marginalized group.
- Mega development projects and its impact on the underprivileged communities.
- Government initiatives and their impact on under privileged people
- Role of civil societies /NGOs /corporates in development of marginalized groups.
- Inclusive policies in the perspective of development.

Participants: Academicians, Experts, Researchers, Scholars, College and University teachers and also those NGOs actively involved and working towards the positive inclusion of the marginalized groups into the mainstream society will be the vital participants for the seminar.

Call for the Papers: Hard/ soft copies of abstracts (in MS word not exceeding 300 words on the seminar theme/ sub-theme from the prospective participants should reach the Seminar Co-ordinator on or before **10th February, 2016**. The authors will be intimated the acceptance of paper through e-mail. **Full length paper** should be submitted in soft copies on or before **25th February, 2016**.
